"For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope, Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now." (Rom 8.19-22). Until the sacrifice of Christ sin was only set aside for one year. Each year the sins of the people were remembered, confessed and sacrifices offered for them. When Christ came he offered the sacrifice that would be the final

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atonement for all time. The writer of Hebrews tells us that the blood of Christ was for the sins of the past as well as those of the future.
