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2. Condemnation of opposition

- **Job 27.7** Let mine enemy be as the wicked, and he that riseth up against me as the unrighteous.
- Mt:23:27 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto whited sepulchres, which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness.
- **Phil 1.14-16** And many of the brethren in the Lord, waxing confident by my bonds, are much more bold to speak the word without fear. 15: Some indeed preach Christ even of envy and strife; and some also of good will: 16: The one preach Christ of contention, not sincerely, supposing to add affliction to my bonds:
- Acts 9.3-5 And as he journeyed, he came near Damascus: and suddenly there shined round about him a light from heaven: 4: And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? 5: And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: it is hard for thee to kick against the pricks.

3. Hollow hope

- **Job 27.8-10** For what is the hope of the hypocrite, though he hath gained, when God taketh away his soul? 9: Will God hear his cry when trouble cometh upon him? 10: Will he delight himself in the Almighty? will he always call upon God?
- **Prov 11.9** An hypocrite with his mouth destroyeth his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered.
- Matt 23.28-31 Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and iniquity. 29: Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the tombs of the prophets, and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous, 30: And say, If we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets.
- 31: Wherefore ye be witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them which killed the prophets.
- Matt 6.5 And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.

4. Inspired instruction

- **Job 27.11-12** I will teach you by the hand of God: that which is with the Almighty will I not conceal. 12: Behold, all ye yourselves have seen it; why then are ye thus altogether vain?
- Acts 20.27 For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God.
- **Rom 10.18** But I say, Have they not heard? Yes verily, their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world.
- **Jer 31.33-34** But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel; After those days, saith the LORD, I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts; and will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34: And they shall teach no more every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the LORD: for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them, saith the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.
- **Col 1.23** If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister;
- **1 Cor 10.11** Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.
