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1. Warning

- **Job 36.17-18** But thou hast fulfilled the judgment of the wicked: judgment and justice take hold on thee. 18: Because there is wrath, beware lest he take thee away with his stroke: then a great ransom cannot deliver thee.
- **Psm 49.5-8** Wherefore should I fear in the days of evil, when the iniquity of my heels shall compass me about? 6: They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches; 7: None of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him: 8: (For the redemption of their soul is precious, and it ceaseth for ever:)
- **Psm 89.48** What man is he that liveth, and shall not see death? shall he deliver his soul from the hand of the grave? Selah.
- **Heb 9.27** And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:
- **Job 36.20-21** Desire not the night, when people are cut off in their place. 21: Take heed, regard not iniquity
- Psm 66.18 If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me
- **John 9.31** Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth
- Job 36.21 Take heed, regard not iniquity: for this hast thou chosen rather than affliction
- **Heb 11.24-26** By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; 25: Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; 26: Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.
- **Heb 12.11** Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.

2. Admonition

- Job 36.24 Remember that thou magnify his work, which men behold
- Psm 40.5 Many, O LORD my God, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done, and thy

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thoughts which are to us-ward: they cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee: if I would declare and speak of them, they are more than can be numbered.

Psm 92.4-5 - For thou, LORD, hast made me glad through thy work: I will triumph in the works of thy hands. 5: O LORD, how great are thy works! and thy thoughts are very deep.

Job 36.26 - Behold, God is great, and we know him not, neither can the number of his years be searched out.

Isa 55.8-9 - For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. 9: For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.
