### **2. A man full of talk**

**Job 11.2** - Should not the multitude of words be answered? and should a man full of talk be justified?

**Prov 10.19** - In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: but he that refraineth his lips is wise.

**1 Tim 1.4** - Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: so do.

**1 Tim 4.7** - But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself rather unto godliness.

**Prov 23.9** - Speak not in the ears of a fool: for he will despise the wisdom of thy words.

**Ecc 5.1-2** - Keep thy foot when thou goest to the house of God, and be more ready to hear, than to give the sacrifice of fools: for they consider not that they do evil. 2: Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few.

**Ecc 10.12-14** - The words of a wise man's mouth are gracious; but the lips of a fool will swallow up himself. 13: The beginning of the words of his mouth is foolishness: and the end of his talk is mischievous madness. 14: A fool also is full of words: a man cannot tell what shall be; and what shall be after him, who can tell him?

### **3. Discounting doctrine**

**Job 11.4** - For thou hast said, My doctrine is pure, and I am clean in thine eyes.

**Prov 12.15** - The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise.

**Prov 16.2** - All the ways of a man are clean in his own eyes; but the LORD weigheth the spirits.

**Matt 5.37** - But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.

**1 Pet 4.11** - If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God;

**Job 11.1-4**

**Prov 28.25-26** - He that is of a proud heart stirreth up strife: but he that putteth his trust in the LORD shall be made fat. 26: He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walketh wisely, he shall be delivered.

**Eph 5.15** - See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise,

### **4. Appeal to higher power**

**Job 11.5-6** - But oh that God would speak, and open his lips against thee; 6: And that he would shew thee the secrets of wisdom, that they are double to that which is! Know therefore that God exacteth of thee less than thine iniquity deserveth.

**1 Pet 2.15** - For so is the will of God, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men:

**Job 11.7** - Canst thou by searching find out God? canst thou find out the Almighty unto perfection?

**Ecccl 8.17** - Then I beheld all the work of God, that a man cannot find out the work that is done under the sun: because though a man labour to seek it out, yet he shall not find it; yea further; though a wise man think to know it, yet shall he not be able to find it.

**1 Cor 2.11** - For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God.

**Eph 3.4-5** - Whereby, when ye read, ye may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ) 5: Which in other ages was not made known unto the sons of men, as it is now revealed unto his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit;

**2 Pet 1.3** - According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:
