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2. Why

As we look at the event that occurred in the life of Ahab we can see that there is much to be learned from the attitude that God shows us. This is an unusual event in that we are given a behind the scenes look if you will at how God can and will work against those who are evil in his sight. As we view this there are several points that come to mind that will help us to understand just what is happening.

First of all we have to ask our selves why God would seek the destruction of Ahab and his reign. We have to remember that although they have drifted into idolatry, this is a kingdom of God's people. We find that the path away from God began many years earlier as Jereboam sought to alter the worship of God out of fear. To this end he established idols in two locations (Dan and Beersheba) and then chose men of the lowliest sorts to be priests. This in turn was acceptable to the people since they no longer had to go to Jerusalem to worship. This was a violation of the law of God - the very first commandment was that they were to have no other Gods before them and this was a powerful statement in rejecting God. This only worsened as the years went by so that more evil was introduced into the kingdom over time. Kings were leaders and as such had a very great influence over the mind and direction of the people. James tells us today that if we are to be in that type of position - one which would influence the spiritual direction of others that we are to be warned that there is a greater condemnation for those who will do this. (Jas 3.1). Peter warns that if we speak we are to speak as the oracles of God and not of our own will. Even Christ did this by speaking those things which God had given to him and nothing more or less. Christ of course is our example of what we are to be and what we are to do. So we find that Ahab, following this idolatrous thinking only made matters worse in that he continued to lead the people away from God. One of the ways that he did this was to marry Jezebel, the daughter of the king of Tyre. This was in violation of the fact that had warned about taking wives of the inhabitants of the land as this would influence them and their actions. Jezebel had introduced the worship if baal into the land and had killed many of the prophets who served the Lord. Ezekiel tells us that God does not desire the death of the wicked but that he desires that those who are evil should repent. This is the same messge that was taught on the day of Pentecost as **Peter told those people there to** repent of the sins that they had committed against God and to submit to his authority and not the ideas taht they held to . We find that influence of Ahab had been such that he had corrupted an entire nation. Christ acknowledged that there would be those who would cause others to stumble but stated that it would have been better for that person if a millstone were tied around their neck and they were thrown into the sea. That is an extreme remark but it is one that tells us what God's attitude is toward falsehood and those who would promote it. Today false doctrine abounds in the world and sometimes that falsehood takes root even among God's people. Paul warned about this in his address to the Ephesian elders stating that after he had departed there would be grievous wolves who would enter in, some of which would arise from among their own number and pervert the gospel. Paul later tells of a falling away that would occur later and this is the same situation that we have in the life of Ahab as God takes counsel against him.

Second we are warned that if we pursue a path that is opposite that which God would have us follow that he will use **His means to destroy us.** This was told to the children of Israel as Moses warned the people that God would **turn and do them hurt after he had done so many** good things for them. (). In John's vision on the isle of Patmos, Christ there warns in this vision of the fact that there are groups of his people who will have their **candlestick taken away**

if they do not repent of that which they are doing. This of course means that Christ will not recognize any thing that he has not established and those who fall away through their own error are rejected. Christ stated that there would come a time when every plant that his Father had not planted would be rooted up. We cannot ignore the responsibility that we have to live and teach the word of God faithfully and to fail to do this, willingly will reap the wrath of God. Jude tells us that we must earnestly contend for the faith that was once delivered to the Saints and the way that we do that is to continue in the word, the doctrine that has been delivered. John tells us that if there is any who will come to us and does not have this doctrine that we are to reject that individual - Christ will not recognize the things that these people do and neither can we. There are those who believe tht we should never speak against the beliefs of others and this is becoming a prevalent thing in our society. We cannot however accept those things that God does not accept. In this particular instance Ahab was to be visited by a spirit who would become a lying spirit in the mouths of those prophets that Ahab trusted. The interesting thing about this is that Ahab should have known what the will of God was and should have understood the warnings that were contained in it. The same is true of us today. We must be aware of the dangers of believing in those things that God does not sanction and leads to the third point that this situation brings out.

Ahab, in his rejection of God apparently was aware of his evil and there were times when he sought out the prophets of the Lord who he hoped would tell him what to do to avert catastrophe. The problem is that Ahab did not have an honest heart in these things. This is the same thing that James warns us about. James states that we must **not be double minded**, that is we must not confuse ourselves on the issues of right and wrong simply because we do not wish to accept those things that God states. Balaak was willing to curse the people of God for a price although he knew full well that he should not do this. His human desire and greed got the better of his judgment and his nature, that of being one who desired to do as he pleased eventually led to his destruction for the evil that he had done. Today people will seek out those who will tell them what they want to hear. Paul states that in the latter days there would be those who would have itching ears who would turn away from the gospel. If we surround ourselves with those who teach and practice what God does not allow then we will eventually bring spiritual destruction on ourselves. Paul, speaking of this attitude, in his warnings of the falling away, or apostasy as we know it, states that God will send strong delusions on those who do not receive the love of the truth. If we do not love God nor respect his truth as it has been revealed then we will only find ourselves opposing God. In this way we cannot stand justified before God. The problem with Ahab was that he loved himself more than he loved God. Ahab for the most part had completely rejected God. We find that it only takes a small error to lead us astray. Paul, speaking of sin compares this to leaven in bread. He states that only a small amount will leaven all. In the same way even the smallest error will lead us into a state of spiritual condemnation. James states that those who offend in one point are guilty of all and we find that there are doctrines in the world that sometimes are very close to what God states in his word, and there are others that have drifted so far away from the truth that those who have adopted this attitude are unable to recognize it when it is presented.

The final result of all this is that we can fail to learn to love God. Christ stated that if we **love him we will keep his commandments**. The question that we need to ask is do we love God. Do we love him enough to sacrifice those ideas that we may be holding to that are not in

accordance with his will. If w obey it.	e love God then we	e will accept what	he has given us and	we will
