The Philippians

Phil 1.1-10

1. Philippi

- Acts 16.9-12 And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us. 10: And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them. 11: Therefore loosing from Troas, we came with a straight course to Samothracia, and the next day to Neapolis; 12: And from thence to Philippi, which is the chief city of that part of Macedonia, and a colony: and we were in that city abiding certain days.
- **Acts 16.14** And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.
- **Acts 16.16** And it came to pass, as we went to prayer, a certain damsel possessed with a spirit of divination met us, which brought her masters much gain by soothsaying:
- **Acts 16.21** And teach customs, which are not lawful for us to receive, neither to observe, being Romans.
- **Acts 16.25-26** And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. 26: And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.
- Acts 16.32-33 And they spake unto him the word of the Lord, and to all that were in his house. 33: And he took them the same hour of the night, and washed their stripes; and was baptized, he and all his, straightway.
- **Acts 16.38** And the serjeants told these words unto the magistrates: and they feared, when they heard that they were Romans.
- **Acts 16.40** And they went out of the prison, and entered into the house of Lydia: and when they had seen the brethren, they comforted them, and departed.

2. Beloved

- **Phil 1.4-5** Always in every prayer of mine for you all making request with joy, 5: For your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now;
- **Psm 133.1** Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!

The Philippians

Phil 1.1-10

- **Col 1.18** And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence.
- **3 John 9-10** I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who loveth to have the preeminence among them, receiveth us not. 10: Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself receive the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth them out of the church.
- **Phil 1.7** Even as it is meet for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my heart; inasmuch as both in my bonds, and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel, ye all are partakers of my grace.
- **1 Cor 13.4-5** Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, 5: Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

3. Preservation

- **Phil 1.9** And this I pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and in all judgment;
- **2 Tim 2.15** Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
- **1 Tim 4.13-15** Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. 14: Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery. 15: Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all.
- **Phil 1.10** That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ;
- **John 7.24** Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment.
- **Heb 5.13-14** For every one that useth milk is unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. 14: But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.
