- **Job 12.3** But I have understanding as well as you; I am not inferior to you: yea, who knoweth not such things as these?
- **Job 6.13** Is not my help in me? and is wisdom driven quite from me?
- 1 Cor 2.3 And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling.
- **2 Cor 12.9** And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

Job 12.1-6

- **Job 12.5** He that is ready to slip with his feet is as a lamp despised in the thought of him that is at ease.
- **Job 4.3-5** Behold, thou hast instructed many, and thou hast strengthened the weak hands. 4: Thy words have upholden him that was falling, and thou hast strengthened the feeble knees. 5: But now it is come upon thee, and thou faintest; it toucheth thee, and thou art troubled.
- **Psm 35.13-16** But as for me, when they were sick, my clothing was sackcloth: I humbled my soul with fasting; and my prayer returned into mine own bosom. 14: I behaved myself as though he had been my friend or brother: I bowed down heavily, as one that mourneth for his mother. 15: But in mine adversity they rejoiced, and gathered themselves together: yea, the abjects gathered themselves together against me, and I knew it not; they did tear me, and ceased not: 16: With hypocritical mockers in feasts, they gnashed upon me with their teeth.
